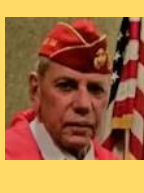

This month we honor the passing on May 17, 2019, after a lengthy illness, of one of our own former and founding members of Lakeland Detachment as well as a former National MCL Commandant—MARINE JOHN W. KOVALCIK

Marine John W. Kovalcik was born in 1937 and enlisted in the U. S. Navy Reserve on July 14th 1954. In October 1956, John transferred from the Naval Reserve and joined the Marine Corps. He served on the USS Leyte, serving with the Flag Command, Carrier Division 18. After nineteen months of Foreign Service duty, he reported to Camp Lejeune where he joined Support Company "A" as a Prison Chaser and served on Brig Duty.

Marine Kovalcik was a member of the Marine Corps League since 1991 when he joined the Lakeland New Jersey Detachment. After moving to South Carolina, he joined the Grand Strand Detachment #873 where, for 15 years, he served as a co-coordinator with Keenan Walsh of the Horry County Toys for Tots drive. He also served as Trustee and later as Detachment Commandant. He went on to serve as Aide-De-Camp for the Department of South Carolina, Department Sr. Vice Commandant for three years, and the National Division Vice Commandant for the Southeast Division for three years. In August 2008, John was elected National Judge Advocate. In 2010, he was elected National Jr. Vice Commandant and in 2012 he was elected National Sr. Vice Commandant. Marine Kovalcik was elected National Commandant of the Marine Corps League in 2014.

In recognition of his many years of service to his community and to the Marine Corps League, John was selected as National Marine of the Year in 2008. He also received the Chapel of Four Chaplains Legion of Honor Award.

Marine Kovalcik taught Vocational Education for 10 years and retired from the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. He held a Commercial Pilots License, Instrument Rated and had a Ground Instructors Rating, (inactive). His wife Judy predeceased John several years ago. They had been married for more than 50 years and had a son, a daughter, and five grandchildren. They resided in Myrtle Beach, SC. John was the 60th National Commandant.

Those of us who were at the State convention in June, 2015 had the distinct pleasure and honor of meeting John since he was a guest speaker at the convention. He had fond memories of Lakeland Detachment, of New Jersey and of our famed Paymaster, Peter Alvarez and his Wife, Gracie. John had a clever wit and good sense of humor.

The Marines of Lakeland Detachment offer our condolences to the family of Marine, John Kovalcik. Although the streets of Heaven have received another fine Marine, you will be missed here, John. Rest in Peace, Marine.

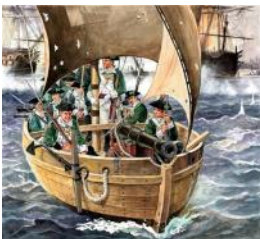




Greetings Marines,

As I sit down to write this month's column, it is the evening of Memorial Day. It's been a busy weekend with work on Saturday, our ceremonies at the monument in Pompton Lakes, followed the VFW ceremonies, the parade and ceremonies in Oakland and today the parade (as a spectator) and ceremonies in Fairlawn. I consider it an honor to remember those who are forever immortalized in President Lincoln's Gettysburg Address, "that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion, that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain, that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth." Edward Everett, whose 2 hour plus oration on the Battle of Gettysburg and the civil war preceded President Lincoln's address, is reported to have said he wished that he had gotten as close to the point in the 2 hours of his speech as the president in the less than 3 minutes of the Gettysburg Address.

That point is the cause of Freedom and what it meant to the Union at that time of history. And it is even more poignant in today's world. Freedom is the reason why I took my oath of enlistment. It is the reason why most of us became Marines. We were willing and able to stand up amongst our brothers and sisters to, "protect and defend the Constitution of The United States of America from all enemies both foreign and domestic". One of the prayers I heard this past weekend, included an invocation to grant us peace from oppression, from hunger, from racism, from violence, from crime and of course from war. On this day, we set aside time to honor and remember the approximately one and half million or so brave men and women who laid down their lives since the Revolutionary War in the defense of those freedoms. It is fitting and just that we do so. It is also incumbent on us and our succeeding generations to continue the cause for which such a high sacrifice which has been laid down in front of the altar of freedom.



Now on to my history narrative for the month. In June 1950, there was little inclination that there would be yet another major conflict. It was not quite 5 years after WWII ended and our armed forces were mere shadows of what they were at the end of WWII. In fact, June 1950 manpower of the Marine Corps was at 74,249 (total—both officers and enlisted) compared to 469,925 at the end of WWII or about 16% of the Marine Corps at the end of WWII. The Army, the Navy and the fledging Air Force had similar percentages of cuts in man power between 1945 and 1950. Thus our armed forces were in no way ready or prepared to fight in another major conflict. Secretary of State Dean Acheson had recently made a speech concerning US policy and interests that the United States would willingly defend. Sadly, South Korea, which had been established in 1948, was not among those countries or interests. Thus in the predawn hours on June 25th, North Korea sent 8 divisions across the 38th parallel and invaded South Korea. Within 3 days the capitol city of Seoul was captured. President Truman authorized sending US Troops into South Korea and a Naval blockage. General MacArthur, the commander of US Forces—Far East , asked for a Marine Regimental Combat Team. The USMC responded and activated the reserve to begin rebuilding the 1st Marine Division for duty in South Korea. In the meantime, the 1st Marine Provisional Brigade was hastily organized. This was a 4725 man unit formed around the 5th Marine Regiment. It was organized on July 7th 1950 and set sail on or about July 14th. It landed on August 3rd in Pusan and was placed under control of the General Walker and the Eight Army who immediately placed it in reserve in order to launch the first serious counterattack since the beginning of the war. However, the fluid scope of battle in the early months of the Korean War within the Pusan Perimeter, required the use of this force as a fire brigade of sorts to stop breakthroughs in the lines and plug in gaps where it was needed. This was until it was pulled from combat for refitting and replacements in preparation of the Inchon landings as part of the 1st Marine Division. There is little doubt that without the 1st Marine Provisional Brigade, the Pusan Perimeter would have been overrun and US forces would have been evacuated by sea.



To our Korean War Veterans we give thanks and we remember what is often called, The Forgotten War”.

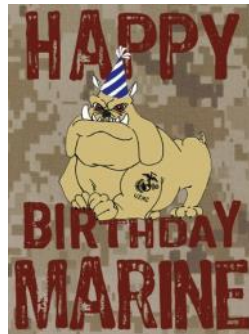

Operation Fallen Hero – Hawthorne, NJ

Since 2011 the Lakeland Detachment has been supporting Operation Fallen Hero in Hawthorne, NJ. The program begun in 2011 dedicates a hometown street to servicemen from Hawthorne who were killed in action or died in the line of duty from World War One through the Vietnam War. Marine Gene Kelley has served as honor guard with the national colors and Marine Raymond Sears has led the rifle salute for the ceremony since the inception of the program.

The ceremonies are conducted on May 1, June 14 and November 11.

To date, Hawthorne has honored forty servicemen including four Marines, two of which were killed in action during the invasion of Saipan during World War II and two Marines during the Korean War.

Sergeant Basilone received the Congressional Medal of Honor for his gallant action during the Battle of Guadalcanal in 1942 and the Navy Cross posthumously for more heroism in the Battle of Iwo Jima where he was killed in 1945.
