VA benefits for Camp Lejeune water contamination

Q: Does my family qualify for VA benefits due to Camp Lejeune 's history of water contamination? A: From the 1950s through the 1980s, people living or working at U.S. Marine

Corps Base Camp Lejeune in Jacksonville, N.C., were potentially exposed to drinking water contaminated with industrial solvents, benzene and other chemicals. Family members who lived at Camp Lejeune for 30 days or more between Aug. 1, 1953, and Dec. 31, 1987, may be eligible for VA health benefits through the Camp Lejeune Family Member Program for 15 conditions: esophageal cancer, breast cancer, kidney cancer, multiple myeloma, renal toxicity, female infertility, scleroderma, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, lung cancer, bladder cancer, leukemia, myelodysplastic syndromes, hepatic steatosis, miscarriage and neurobehavioral effects.

VA is reimbursing family members for eligible out-of-pocket medical expenses related to the "5 covered conditions. However, VA pays for treatment only after it has received payment from all other health plans.

To apply for reimbursement, you must show:

Your relationship to a veteran who served at Camp Lejeune, with a marriage license or birth certificate;

That you lived on the base for 30 days or more between Aug. 1, 1953, and Dec. 31, 1987, with copies of orders or base housing;

That you paid health-care expenses for a covered condition on or after March 26, 2013 (the date Congress began to cover the Camp Lejeune Family Member Program), with receipts.

This program only covers the conditions listed above; it doesn't meet the minimum standard for health coverage under the Affordable Care Act.


