He hung his boot camp picture in his barber shop and invited others to do the same. On November 10, 1989 Tom and other Marines, Hank Kuhn Sr. and Jr., Tim Driscoll, Howard Shofner, Mike Magner, Marty Hanse, Tony Franco, Desmond Reiser, Zack Ziccardi, Brad Sacoli, John Fitzgerald, Jeremiah Lucey, Joe Wasaki, Bob Kenyon, Harry Kaufman and Victor Paliotta gathered at the Tun Tavern of Wanaque (Holy Mackeral Bar and Grill) to celebrate the 214th Marine Corps Birthday. Tom provided the cake, had each in attendance stand and introduce themselves as none of them knew each other.

Learning there was an organization of Marines called the Marine Corps League, Tom set about finding out the requirements to organize a detachment. Since they met in the Lakeland area, the name Lakeland Detachment was adopted with 744 assigned by the Department of New Jersey Marine Corps League. In order to obtain a charter, 25 members were required. Tom started to recruit members by knocking on doors of homes flying the Marine Corps Flag and in December, 1990 received the official Charter. Tom knocked on my door in 1991.



Chaplains Desk December 2015

A while ago TK Rydgren wrote this letter to your Chaplain about his friend "Dewey" after his passing, and it has been sitting on the desk, waiting to be resurrected. (TK, your letter along with this wonderful Marine story will finally be enjoyed by the members of our detachment!)

"Dewey joined us as a replacement in our rifle platoon with twenty other Marines. We were being thinned out by causalities we had taken last April. Dewey fit right in with our platoon. He was a quiet, likeable guy who didn't shirk work or his time on watch at night.

I had not seen Dewey again after I rotated home in November of 1951 until the A/1/1 reunion in Williamsburg, VA. He brought up what I did in assaulting Hill 749 in Sept of 1951 and I brought up what he did in assaulting an enemy position in June of 1951.

After we had taken the enemy's position that June, we then moved further up the hill to dig in for the night. Dewey excused himself to go to the aid station to have a wound attended to and he said that he would be right back. He had taken a burp gun bullet just above his wrist where it traveled up his arm. You could see the bulge just under the skin.

At the reunion I mentioned that incident to him and he advised me that he didn't have that bullet removed that night in Korea after all.

Instead, when he rotated back to the states the following year, he was stationed at Camp Lejeune, and of course, one day there was going to be an inspection in which Dewey didn't want to participate. Instead, that day of the inspection, he went over to sick bay and finally got that bullet removed. This was our Dewey! He carried that bullet around for over a year without complaining and by the way, he also earned the Bronze star for his heroism back on that hill.















You have all heard members from other services talk about how the Marines all stick together and remain a tight group of soldiers for their entire lives and that other services do not do that.
