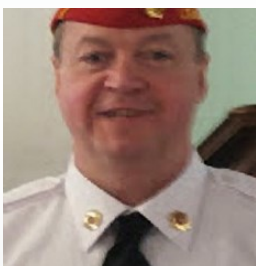

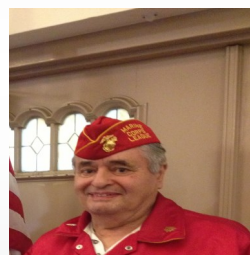

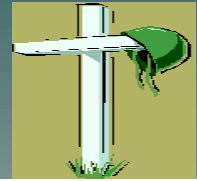

GOLDEN PANTHERS TAME DOVER TIGERS 35-12

The Pequannock High School varsity football squad opened their season with an impressive home victory against Dover. The contest was prefaced with a moving tribute to those who perished on September 11, 2001. Four members of the Marine Corps League Lakeland Detachment #744 Color Guard, veterans Gene Kelley, Kevin O'Leary, Les Derbyshire, and Peter Alvarez, made a special appearance. The quartet sported official military uniforms-navy blue trousers, white short-sleeve shirts with an emblem of United States flag sewn on one shoulder, and red caps (covers) with gold trim, offset by spit-shine black shoes. The veterans, two with rifles and two with flags-the Marine Corps and the American-marched from the far goal line to midfield. A hush fell over the capacity crowd as a moment of silence was followed by the National Anthem.

The opening Pequannock kick-off was a 15-yard squibber which resulted in excellent opening field position for Dover. Two running plays garnered substantial yardage. However, a false start stalled the brief drive.

The next play characterized the entire first half. On paper, the Tigers virtually drew even with Pequannock for the first 24 minutes. However, due to numerous bad snaps, Dover's squad was relegated to mere paper Tigers (no pun intended).

The Dover quarterback chose to call signal from the shotgun. The ensuing hike sailed over his head, resulting in a huge loss. The play seemed to awaken the slumbering Golden Panther defense as a QB-keeper was nailed by John Tashon and senior Derek Nelson. Another run was stymied. The Tigers were forced to punt. Nelson and sophomore Sean Klimek were set deep to await the kick. However, the pair needed not bother. Again, Dover's long snap failed, this time soaring even more wildly, far from the punter's desperate grasp.

Armed with the pigskin, deep in enemy territory, senior quarterback Tom Crooks handed off to Klimek who scooted for 10-yards. Crooks then kept for a nice gainer off right tackle. On second and four, Matt Forrest burst up the middle. The 5-yard scamper by the 5-10, 190 pound running back marked the first touchdown of Pequannock's season. Senior kicker Dan Duffy (Mr. Automatic) calmly booted the extra point. The Golden Panthers enjoyed a 7-0 lead.

Pequannock's next kick-off was a line-drive that was picked up by the Dover return man on one bounce. With a full head of steam, the runner bolted forward. Aided by a face-mask penalty on Pequannock, the Tigers started their second offensive series on the Golden Panther 42-yard line. Yet again, the seemingly simple task of the basic hike came back to haunt the Tigers. Another poor snap occurred. However, Dover bounced back with a 40-yard touchdown run on the very next play. The extra point failed, resulting in PTHS hanging on to a tenuous, one-point lead, 7-6.

Forrest fielded the ensuing Tiger kickoff near the goal line. Bolting up the middle, the senior speedster turned on the jets and slanted right, behind a wall of Golden Panther blockers. The result was a first-and-ten for Pequannock on the Dover 16-yard line. However, a penalty and a batted-down pass by a huge Dover rush squelched the rally.

The hard hitting game was marked by numerous injuries to players from both teams. However, none seemed serious as players were able to walk off the field to warm applause by fans from both sides.

The Golden Panther defense then rallied to the occasion. Joseph, a.k.a. J.J., from his left tackle position, stonewalled a Tiger run, with a little help from his

friend, Matt Forrest. The Dover quarterback then attempted a run up the middle but was rudely greeted by senior linebacker, and captain, Kershaw, with a hit that could be heard all the way to Jones Hardware. Incredibly, another errant hike, this time intended for the punter, went A.W.O.L. for the Tigers. The pigskin was pounced upon by Pequannock senior Jake Foukas.

The Golden Panther offense capitalized on the miscue, taking only 16 seconds to hit pay dirt. After a pass to the far left corner of the end zone barely missed, Crooks handed off to Klimek, who powered into the end zone by breaking two tackles.

Pequannock senior defensive end Tyler Bockhorn served several punishing tackles to running backs on the following Dover offensive series. Crooks then intercepted a wounded Dover duck near mid-field and cruised to the Tiger 24-yard line. On first down, Forrest bounced off a pancake block by senior left tackle Mike Yaconis, for eight yards. However, an errant pass and a no-gain run brought up fourth down. From under center, Crooks handed off to Klimek who scooted in for the score. Unfortunately, the apparent TD was nullified due to a penalty. An interception in the end zone thwarted the scoring threat.

Soon thereafter, the Pequannock offense was back in business, courtesy of a Tashon interception of an ill-advised Tiger pass over the middle. With senior wide receiver Jamie Morella split wide right, Crooks and his offensive counterparts fooled the Tiger defense. The former sprinted deep. The latter rolled right, and found senior fullback Craig Mc. with a beautiful floater to the right flat. However, another yellow flag against Pequannock curtailed momentum. A perfect coffin-corner punt by Duffy atoned, somewhat, for the penalty.

Back at the ranch, a 9-yard scoring jaunt by Klimek and an electrifying 65-yard punt return for a touchdown by senior Derrick Nelson, proved to be the straws that broke the camel's (or rather, Dover's) back. Breaking several tackles, while doing so, Nelson's score upped the ante to PTHS 28-Dover 6, as the second quarter horn sounded.



The Golden Panther Varsity Marching Band offered a dazzling halftime display, led by drum major-student conductors, James DeCumber, Deanna Cannizzaro, and Allie Kozell. Marching to a plethora of musical genres sprinkled with dramatic crescendos and decrescendos, Greek mythology was in order. The first three movements of 'Pandora's Box'-Zeus, Plagues, and Hope-resolved into the finale-'Without Evil, There Is No Good.'" Also featured were tunes played from the bleachers, including the familiar fall football foray and PTHS school fight song, 'On Wisconsin', as well as the peppy, 'Hey Song'. The sparkling performance marked the fall debut of both the band and first year Director Anthony Streifer.



Not to be outdone, the Pequannock student body was in full force. If an overnight institution has ever been created, this is it. Patriotism was the theme. The 200-strong member cheering section was led by seniors Trevor Warner, Kenny Fox, and Adam Curich, in dress and school spirit. Warner, clad in his varsity wrestling uniform, donned a wild, red, white, and blue wig, with matching shades, all the while waving a huge American flag. Fox wore a white cape, complimented by red and blue face paint. Curich sported a red bandanna headband. Dozens of students waved small U.S.A. flags. The vociferous young crowd even provided an encore of the National Anthem during second half action. Also serenaded was junior Janelle M. with the song, 'Happy Birthday'. Last, but not least, as the clock wound down with Pequannock's victory assured, students sang the 1970 iconic smash hit by one-hit wonder Steam, 'Na Na Hey Hey Kiss Him Goodbye'.

A quarterback sneak for a score by Crooks in the second half provided icing on the cake for Pequannock. Sophomore QB Dave Jachera relieved his senior mentor in the last frame, handing in a competent performance.
